





MIGRATION



The eastern bluebird is a permanent resident in many southern areas. Some populations will travel north in early spring. Bluebirds that breed in the northernmost regions of the species' range are **obligate migrants**. These birds must leave the freezing winter temperatures in the region.


MIGRATION MAZE

Help the bluebird find his way south for the winter!



Migration is the travelling of long distances for food. Migration is a part of the survival of many types of birds. In the winter, there is not enough food for certain birds. They will fly to warmer areas to find food and return north in the spring to breed.

FACT: Not all birds migrate. Birds such as pigeons, crows and ravens are able to survive in the winter.



HABITAT

Date

Eastern bluebirds can usually be found perched on telephone poles or atop nest boxes. Bluebirds live in meadows and large fields surrounded by trees. Bluebirds are **cavity nesters**, which means they will build their nests in holes in old trees or posts.



NEST TRAILS

Habitat loss and the switch from wooden fencing to metal posts, has made natural nest sites hard to find. We can help eastern bluebirds by putting up nest boxes or creating bluebird trails. A bluebird trail is a group of nest boxes placed close by each other.
